Family Members: Family Membership consists of a household of members which may include a spouse or partner and/or their children. Children shall be included in Family Membership until they are 18 years. Parent/s and/or extended family residing with a couple will have to pay separate membership fees unless they qualify for 65+ membership (refer below).

Single Member: Single Membership consists of a member who seeks sole membership to CDIA, regardless of whether they are with or without a spouse or partner and/or children. The benefits of CDIA single membership shall extend to that member only, and shall not extend to their spouse or partner and/or their children.

65+ Membership:

A CDIA member shall be exempted from paying the annual CDIA subscription once that member has:

- i. reached the age of 65 as of 1st January of the financial year and
- ii. has been a financial member for a period of 10 or more consecutive years prior to 1st January of the financial year.

For a couple when only one spouse or partner qualifies this exemption of the annual CDIA subscriptions will also apply to the non-qualified spouse or partner.

Exemption of the annual CDIA subscription does not extend towards the payment of any entry fees and/or costs payable for events hosted by CDIA.

CDIA life membership nomination



CDIA finalised its Life Membership Policy in 2017 which outlines the criteria and process to nominate, award and recognise individuals who have provided exemplary service and contribution to CDIA. The policy was voted in unanimously at the AGM.

Any CDIA member can nominate another CDIA member, as long as they have a been a financial member for the past five years. All nominations are to be sent to the Secretary by 31st December of each year, at which time nominations will be evaluated and voted on at the next AGM.

Life membership is a great honour and therefore should only be awarded in exceptional circumstances. If there are any nominations, please send them to the

Secretary. We hope members carefully consider who they would like to nominate, and view the criteria required for potential nominees.

If you have any queries regarding Life Membership Policy, please contact Anita or Nanubhai. We hope to receive nominations this year as we do have some deserving members worthy of this recognition.



"Invisible" by Jacqueline Leckie



The Christchurch massacre of 2019 raised questions about what it means to belong to an ethnic and/ or religious minority in a country that, despite the mythology of benign race relations, has experienced a long history of underlying prejudice and racism. Despite being the second largest ethnic group within the 'Asian' population of Aotearoa New Zealand, little has been written about the experiences of Indian migrants, either historically or today. Most writing has focused on celebration and integration, but **"Invisible"** speaks of survival and the real impacts racism has on the lives of Indian New Zealanders. It uncovers a story of exclusion that has rendered Kiwi-Indians invisible in the historical narratives of the nation.
