Diwali in The Square 2019

Palmerston North City Council combined with all the Indian Communities in Palmerston North are organising an event 'Diwali in the Square'. This is a first for Palmerston North and it is an event everyone has been looking forward to.



Progress to date:

'Diwali in the Square' will be held on Thursday 24th October, 5:00pm to 8:00pm (To be confirmed). This date was chosen for the following reasons:

- Key people are not in town on the preferred Saturday 19th of October, and the 9th of November is student exam period
- Having it on a Thursday evening will keep it quite contained, and is a good way to test out what will work i.e. starting small this year, and building it up for future years;
- Thursday evenings are late nights for shopping and the Library and many people are likely to be in town anyway;
- This will work in best for the Indian History Exhibition as the set up for that is planned for the weekend prior (tentatively looking at the 20th for the exhibition opening)
- It is the closest date to Diwali 27th October

Decided key elements/feel of the event

- Simple set up, with a small stage and food trucks, community can sell traditional sweets
- Lighting diyas (including lighting of the diyas at start of event programme), projections, coloured lights. lanterns
- A programme of performances (dancing, singing etc.) provided by community, with an MC

PNCC to lead the logistics—bookings (stage, sound and lighting, food trucks, furniture, small marquees), health & safety. Promotion, funding.

The Indian Community to lead the content – providing the content for the programme, providing advice on and helping provide decorations and other cultural aspects, promoting to community, selling traditional sweets and possibly other small items as desired.

To move forward, PNCC need our support. From the community they need our contribution by means of dance items, selling items (sweets etc), and volunteers. Our members have definitely got talent so if anyone is willing to organise items for this event or assist in any other way, please contact Anita Naran.


