# paul patel—president of nzica




CDIA would like to congratulate Nanubhai (Paul) Patel for being elected as President of the New Zealand Indian Central Association (NZICA).

demanding however one of his comments was that he would like executives from various associations to become more involved with the duties that he has to perform over his term as President.






## community service award
